The Philharmonic String Quartet was founded in 2007. It is characterized by uncommon concert programs in various formations. In world-wide performances in Europe, Japan and Cuba, the Ensemble teamed up with famous artists such as the cellist Gautier Capuçon, the Tenor Michael Schade or the Pianist Igor Levit as well as with the Klezmer-Specialist Giora Feldman, the writer Elke Heidenreich and the chansonnier Annette Postel.

The four musicians Bernhard Metz, Clement Courtin, Konstantin Sellheim and Manuel von der Nahmer were awarded international prestigious prizes. They were educated by excellent and famous teachers such as Rainer Kußmaul, Igor Oistrach, Hartmut Rohde and Wolfgang Boettcher.

Being members of the Munich Philharmonic Orchestra, cooperation with the most famous Conductors of the world such as Zubin Mehta, Christian Thielemann, Gustavo Dudamel or Valery Gergiev is routine.

The affiliation to one of the world most famous and tradition-steeped Symphonic Orchestras of Germany influenced definitely the musical and tonal ideas of the Philharmonic String Quartet.
